Prior to joining the Central Fisheries Board, Emma worked as a field instructor in geography and ecology at Kippure House Estate in Co. Wicklow.

Emma was appointed as a Technician for the WFD in 2008, and is particularly involved in the lake fish surveillance monitoring programme. She has extensive experience in various lake survey methodologies including gill netting, fyke netting, conducting bathymetric surveys, and is currently involved in developing hydroacoustic methodology for surveying fish populations in lakes and deep rivers. She is also experienced in electric-fishing in rivers and various transitional water sampling techniques, including seine netting and beam trawling.
